OUR COMMITMENT

Finavera Renewables is committed to sound and responsible environmental management, public dialogue, and community consultation. We will work with your community to appropriately address items such as job creation, noise and siting impacts, and recreational access to project areas. Our goal is to develop clean energy sources in cooperation with local communities.

WHY DEVELOP IN THE PEACE REGION?

The Peace Region has some of the best wind resources in Canada. Estimated mean annual wind speeds between 7.5 metres/second and 10.5 metres/second allow for economical wind power generation. Due to oil and gas development in the region, and the WAC Bennett Dam, our projects will be near BC Hydro power lines. These two factors make this area an excellent location for potential wind projects.

THE NEED FOR WIND ENERGY

For the last five years, British Columbia has been a net importer of energy. We use more electricity than we produce, so we have to import power to make up the difference. In the 2007 Energy Plan, the province has committed to making BC energy self sufficient by 2016. Wind power can be part of the mix. Increased electricity generation within the province means we have to import less, and that leads to energy security for our province. Wind power is also a clean energy source, and contributes to lower greenhouse gas emissions.

HOW DOES WIND ENERGY WORK?

Most wind turbines consist of 3 rotor blades that rotate around a horizontal hub. The blades face into the wind and rotate as the wind passes through them. The rotating motion powers turbines that convert the motion into electricity. The electricity is transported from the wind turbine to the grid along cables which will be buried underground within the wind farm site.



OUR PROJECTS

Finavera Renewables has four projects we are hoping to develop in the Peace Region. Three are located near Tumbler Ridge, and one is located near Chetwynd. All of the project sites are located on Crown Land, and are primarily situated on ridge-tops. The exact locations of wind turbines have yet to be determined, but the attached map gives a general idea of the project locations. For each of our four Peace Region projects, we estimate between 37 and 56 turbines. The footprint of projects within that size range would be approximately 10 – 15 hectares.
